



Employment Opportunity at the Leelanau Conservancy: Part-Time Stewardship Intern

Project Description: The Leelanau Conservancy is one of the nation's top accredited land trusts. For 31 years, our mission has been to conserve the land, water and scenic character of Leelanau County in Northwest Lower Michigan. We are currently seeking an individual with a background or keen interest in land conservation to fill our summer 2020 stewardship intern position. This is an excellent opportunity to learn about land management and natural resource conservation in a hands-on setting.

We have protected over 3,100 acres of natural areas, preserves, and forest reserves; and the stewardship intern will assist with projects to maintain and upgrade our recreational and ecological resources. Projects include trail building and maintenance, upkeep of recreational infrastructure, invasive plant control and ecological management.

Duties:

- Trail building and maintenance
- Cutting, pruning and hauling of brush
- Assist with invasive plant control by manual methods
- Physical upkeep of buildings- painting, restoration, etc.
- Physical upkeep of recreational structures – fences, trail posts, kiosks
- Assist with volunteer work days
- Tool maintenance
- Some office work- database entry and filing
- Assist with set-up, parking and clean-up of events

Minimum Qualifications:

- High school diploma
- Ability to take direction, self starter, good team member, and a positive attitude
- Experience operating and maintaining various types of tools and equipment
- Ability to work outdoors in adverse weather conditions with exposure to mosquitoes, ticks, poison ivy, brambles and thorns.
- Ability to lift 30+ lbs for an extended period of time and hike for 4 hours at a time through moderate terrain and thick vegetation
- Valid driver's license

Preferred Qualifications:

- Experience in natural resource management field work and/or college course work in biological sciences, botany, or natural resources.
- Familiarity with Michigan flora and invasive species identification
- Experience with trail building or building maintenance
- Experience with ecosystem restoration, invasive species control, and herbicide application
- Experience with GPS and data management
- Experience conducting surveys or outreach projects
